**Pedestrian Path Entrance On Center Street In Wilton Town Center
To Be Closed On Or About February 1, 2007**

Wilton, Connecticut – Connecticut Department of Transportation officials have announced that the **entrance to the pedestrian pathway from Old Post Office Square parking lot (next to Portofino's) to Merwin Meadows is scheduled to be closed on or about Thursday, February 1, 2007.** Pedestrians traveling along the path from the north will not have access to Wilton Town Center via this route. The closure is scheduled to last for an extended period of time, for work in association with widening of the Route 33 Bridge over the Norwalk River. The area will be an active construction site with heavy machinery in place.

The work is part of the overall project to widen Route 7 in Wilton that will accommodate two travel lanes, both northbound and southbound, for a length of approximately three miles from Wolfpit Road to Olmstead Hill Road. The project is scheduled for completion in April 2010.

Please use caution when traveling through the construction work zone to ensure the safety of motorists and construction personnel.
