**Work On Widening Route 33 Bridge To Impact Wilton Train Station Parking  
Beginning Week Of December 3, 2007**

**Wilton, Connecticut** – Connecticut Department of Transportation officials have announced that beginning the week of **December 3, 2007**, cranes will be parked in the Wilton Train Station parking lot for the erection of steel beams for widening the Route 33 bridge over the Norwalk River. In order to secure the area for the protection of commuters and their vehicles, a limited number of parking spaces will be removed. The work is scheduled to take place over the next few months.

In addition, Wilton officials would like to remind residents that the entrance to the pedestrian pathway from Old Post Office Square parking lot (near Portofino's Restaurant) to Merwin Meadows remains closed. Due to the Route 33 bridge work, this area is a major construction site with heavy machinery and it is not safe for pedestrian traffic. Residents are asked to please adhere to the closed signage and fencing.

The work is part of the overall project to widen Route 7 in Wilton that will accommodate two travel lanes, both northbound and southbound, for a length of approximately three miles from Wolfpit Road to Olmstead Hill Road. The project is scheduled for completion in April 2010.

Please use caution and follow the posted speed limit when traveling through the construction work zone to ensure the safety of motorists and construction personnel.
